## NI Women's Aid Events and News

- The NI Regional Forum on Domestic Violence met on the 1<sup>st</sup> December were there was a presentation by Cecilia Whitehorn on Northern Ireland Women's Aid Federation's inter-agency Audit Report. This report will be circulated when it is printed.
- December Northern Ireland Women's Aid Federation are having a Christmas buffet and house warming at our new support Services team office in Cookstown on the 17<sup>th</sup> November at 1.15pm.
- Many thanks to all staff and service users for the invaluable contributions during our Tackling Violence at Home Consultations. Our final submission is on the way to government as we speak. Lets hope our voice is heard!

## Other news

- The Parents Advice Centre launched 'Bullying: A Toolkit for Parents' on the 4<sup>th</sup> November to address the growing confusion and concern among parents in Northern Ireland about the issue of bullying. The toolkit has been funded by the Department of Education and aims to help parents recognise the signs of bullying, help bullied children and work with schools on the issue. The toolkit is to be distributed through schools and various parenting networks. A copy of the toolkit document can be obtained from Parents Advice Centre on 028 90 310891.
- On the 8th December 2003, the Children Order Advisory Committee (COAC) launched the "Best Practice Guidance" which provides a definitive statement of good practice on major aspects of Children Order proceedings. - The Domestic Violence, Crime and Victims Bill was introduced in the House of Lords on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2003. The press release is attached. The Bill can be downloaded from http://www.parliament.uk
- The Police Service of Northern Ireland (PSNI), in conjunction with the NSPCC and ChildLine, has launched a new website that provides information on a number of self protection issues to children, young people and parents. Visit the site herehttp://www.urzone.com
- The Law Commission published a consultation paper on Partial Defences to Murder on 31<sup>st</sup> October. The Law Commission are reviewing the operation of diminished responsibility and provocation as partial defences to murder. Under the present law, they result in a conviction for manslaughter, rather than murder, if successfully pleaded. This review is considering these partial defences in the overall context of murder, but with particular reference to murders committed in the context of domestic violence.
